Each year at this time, parishioners have been asked to sign the white ribbon in support of actions to bring awareness to the dangers of pornography. To request ongoing legislation in the Criminal Code

of Canada to address issues of all forms of sexual exploitation. This year, at St. Bernard's we are invited to sign the purple cards at the entrances of the church. These cards also provide an area where individuals may include a short message to the government. All of the cards will be delivered to our Member of Parliament, Ginette Pettipas-Taylor with a letter of explanation and a request that she forward these to the Minister of Justice. Sexual exploitation destroys the human dignity of the body and spirit of victims of all ages. (Pornography Hurts Campaign began in the Hamilton Diocese in the 1990's- Catholic Women's League)



The annual St. Bernard's Catholic Women's League Holly Tea & Sale will be held on Sat., Nov. 4th, 2 - 4 PM in the church hall.

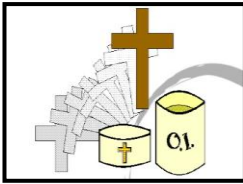

At the initiative of Pope Pius XI in 1926, the 2nd last Sunday during October became known as World Mission Sunday. Catholics throughout the world are invited to pray for and give to the Missions. The collection this Sunday is organized by the Pontifical Missions Society. The funds collected assist some 1,250 mission dioceses under the responsibility of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples. A portion of the Canadian contributions to this collection assists six mission dioceses in Northern Canada.



COMMUNAL CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

It is important that those who are sick and those around them understand the significance of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick as a sacrament of healing. Who should celebrate this sacrament?

- Those who are elderly and whose frailty is becoming more pronounced
- Those adults and children who are suffering from a major illness. (Illness comes in many different forms - physical, mental, psychological, emotional, spiritual)
- Those who are facing or recovering from surgery or serious medical tests
- Those suffering from a serious accident
- Those who suffer from chronic illness such as arthritis or diabetes
- Those who care for the sick, especially those who are closely bound in love to them.

The English churches of the Moncton Diocese work together to offer this communal celebration two or three times a year. Join us on **Thursday, October 26 at 9:30 AM for mass and the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick to be held at St. Bernard's Church.** All parishioners within the three English pastoral units are invited and encouraged to participate in this celebration.



Our Syrian family has arrived! We will have a parish meet and greet Sunday, Oct. 22, 2017 following the 11:00 AM Mass

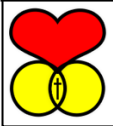

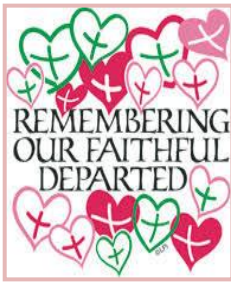
