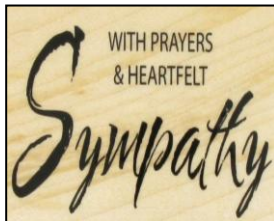

To request ongoing legislation in the Criminal Code of Canada to address issues of all forms of sexual exploitation. This year, at St. Bernard's, we are invited to sign the

purple cards at the entrances of the church. These cards also provide an area where individuals may include a short message to the government. All of the cards will be delivered to our Member of Parliament, Ginette Pettipas-Taylor with a letter of explanation and a request that she forward these to the Minister of Justice. 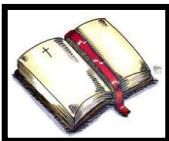

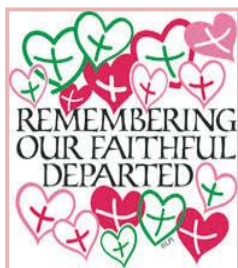
Book of the Faithful Departed
