Storyteller and Evangelist: The Gospel According to Luke: How is Luke's story our story? Did you know that Luke has Jesus preaching a sermon on the *Plain*? Very soon the Church will turn its attention to the Gospel of Luke and we will hear his Gospel proclaimed most often on Sunday. To help get a sense of the message Luke is sharing, join Dr. Andrew Wilson on Saturday, December 1st from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at Holy Family Church Hall as he takes an indepth look at Luke and his Gospel. Dr. Wilson is associate professor of Religious Studies at Mount Allison University, and a frequent and popular presenter for the Office of Faith Development. Implementation of the new phrasing of Our Father, in French only: at the annual meeting of the French Sector in September 2018, the Catholic Bishops of Canada decided that, as of the first Sunday of Advent (December 2 2018), the new French translation of the Our Father (approved by the Vatican) will officially replace the old version. More specifically, the wording "Ne nous laisse pas entrer en tentation", will replace the current text "Ne nous soumets pas à la tentation" which has been in use across Canada since 1966. Archbishop Valéry Vienneau.

Effective immediately <u>parking is no longer free</u> in the evenings and weekends in the lot on the corner of Botsford / Queen / Alma.

HotSpot Parking will be operating the lot. They have developed an Application for mobile devices which allows parkers to use the lot for \$2 per hour. In order to use HotSpot, you need to have access to a smart phone or computer. The first step is downloading the app and creating an account. Throughout the year money donated to our 'needy fund' has been used to help those in need in many ways. This fund is used to help with the Christmas boxes and food requests throughout the year. Our financial support continues to aid Reconnect in providing housing, medical help, work clothing and identification to name a few. St. Bernard's has been an ongoing source of assistance to Reconnect since they began in 2000. Reconnect does an assessment and background check before providing financial assistance. We have also provided financial support to Nazareth House who operate a shelter

as one of their many services. Due to much needed renovations at their facility, the shelter will be closed for a period of time. That will create a loss for the homeless who depend on this service. Nazareth House is working to complete the renovations as quickly as possible. Thank you for your support, compassion and generosity throughout the year. More to come...

Donations made to Christmas Boxes: Some groups and individuals in the parish choose to make donations specifically for the Christmas Boxes. Those funds are used to purchase all the items in the food box which not only make a turkey dinner for Christmas day, but also has enough food to use throughout the week. Any donations made for Christmas Boxes can be placed in an envelope with your name and if applicable, your envelope number, to receive a receipt for income tax purposes. At St. Bernard's we prepare 50 boxes in collaboration with the Food Depot.

World Day for the Poor November 18: Pope Francis has identified November 18 as World Day for the Poor. We are called upon to respond with prayer, acts of charity and social action. The 'People in Need' envelope is used to support agencies in the community that work for the marginalized and vulnerable, as well as provide immediate aid to individuals. Syrian Family Update

The strong sense of Community and the welcome extended by our Church members, their neighbourhood, government officials and support agencies like MAGMA, have convinced our Syrian family that Moncton is an ideal place to stay.

It has been one year and almost three months since our family arrived in Moncton. As you are aware, our family consists of the mother and father, twin girls aged five years, and the mother's sister.

Our committee members were extremely fortunate to find a place with an engaging and welcoming neighbourhood. Within weeks of their arrival, the girls were enrolled in school, under the watchful eye of a teacher who happened to be not only a resident of the neighbourhood, but a member of our Church as well!

The first year has been challenging. A new country with a new culture had to be absorbed along with all the stresses of beginning a totally new life. Unlike many Syrians, the family did have a good command of the English language. However, they soon found through their English training classes, that many of their words had to be relearned for a different pronunciation.

The couple, both of whom left successful careers built over time, also had to overcome the frustration of no employment prospects after countless job applications and promising interviews. Perseveration did pay off however, as Issa was offered employment with the Dollarama , and Suzanne now has a part time position with Sephora in Champlain Mall.

Suzanne's sister, Suha, is completing the requirements for the English training, needed for future citizenship. She had a part time job, but is now enrolled in an Administrative course in college.

Both Issa and Suzanne have also expressed gratitude at the opportunity of getting to know their daughters better because of the additional time that they can now spend together. The long hours in their previous working life had required the need for a full time person to look after the children. As an added bonus, Suzanne's mother is now living with them. She also has a part time job, and looks after the children when Suzanne is working.

Issa and Suzanne are determined to work hard at achieving successful careers and providing a future for their children. They are also looking at ways to bring her sister, husband and infant child, currently refugees in Lebanon, to Moncton.

They are very thankful to the members of Saint Bernard's Church, who have made it possible for their young family to start a new life free from oppression and persecution.

The Social justice Committee is continuing to support this family for the next year to ensure that they can firmly establish themselves. Continued contributions to our Syrian fund are welcome and we want to thank everyone who has participated in this rewarding initiative.
