## United We Stand? Sit? Kneel?

As a young person growing up in the Roman Catholic tradition and attending Immaculate Heart of Mary weekly, the last thing that was on my mind at Mass was being in community. While

subconsciously I was being formed by my faith community; consciously, it was about me and God. I can still recall coming into the church, blessing myself with holy water and proceeding directly to my seat where I would shut the world out with my own personal prayer. Fast forward about fifteen years; there I am sitting in my first liturgical formation workshop (as I had just volunteered to be a lector), and I am hearing, seemingly for the first time to me, the importance of the community and the vital role they (we) play in powerful liturgy. It was the moment where I came to the realization that Mass wasn't just about God and me. There were hundreds of people around me who showed up that day for reasons that were similar to mine. God was just as present to them as to me. It wasn't (and isn't) about God and me; it's about God and us. Please don't get me wrong: I am not saving that a personal relationship with God is not important. It is in fact, the foundation of our faith. But, when we come to liturgy, from the moment we put our hand on the door of the church, we enter "community". We come from our personal prayer and preparation and enter communal prayer. We are now, in a very tangible way, the Body of Christ. This truly defines who we are. As Pope Francis said in Gaudete et Exsultate (Rejoice and be Glad): "We are never completely ourselves unless we belong to a people. That is why no one is saved alone, as an isolated individual." When in community, we pray as community. We stand together, we sit together, we sing together, we listen together, we do everything together. As the hymn reminds us: "We are one body, one body in Christ, and we do not stand alone." While it is true that we all come from different backgrounds and have been taught different things about what to do at Mass, how to pray and what reverence is supposed to look like, it is still so important to remember that unity in prayer and posture trumps everything. In my recent experience of attending Mass, the time in the liturgy when we should be the most unified is the time when we are most divided. I am speaking of the "Communion Rite". It seems that at this time (more than any other time in the Mass) is when we truly "do our own thing". I am not here to say what posture is the correct one, or that one is better than another; I am saying that whatever is the norm for the community you are worshipping in that day, then that should be your posture as well. It is more important to be in community than to be right. Debates about what direction your church should go in are best left for meetings at another time. For this time, we respect and honour the presence of God in our community and our prayer. Mark Mahoney.

# Saint Bernard's Church Building Committee Update

As a follow up to our capital campaign for the purchase of the adjoining parking lot and the sale of the Rectory, your Building Committee would like to provide the following update.

Agreements were signed in late September to purchase the land adjacent to the Church and to sell the Rectory to a Developer . The proceeds from the sale of the Rectory would have offset a portion of the purchase price for the land.

However, both of these agreements have been cancelled following communication from the Developer's lawyer stating that;

- the Rectory sale and land purchase would now have to be separate transactions; and,
- the purchase of the Rectory would be deferred to a later date with a reduced purchase offer.

The Developer did however offer to amend the parking lot mortgage financing arrangement outlined in the original agreement to include the amount no longer available from sale proceeds of the Rectory.

The revised terms offered were considered unacceptable to the Committee for the following reasons;

- the proceeds from the sale of the Rectory were necessary to support the purchase price of the land; and,
- the \$1,000,000 Capital Campaign needed to support this initiative reached only 25% of its target.

Your Committee is now back to assessing our options which will include;

- a letter to Parishioners on the status of their current contribution and future commitments to the Capital Campaign;
- possible partnerships on solutions needed for a parking issue that has become more
  evident with the loss of available parking in the adjacent lot as well as the lot facing the
  Church, and:
- seeking offers from other parties interested in the development of the Rectory.

We wish to thank everyone who has participated in this initiative and remain committed to finding solutions to ensure that our Church will continue playing a strong role in Moncton's faith community for generations to come.

## Parishioners in hospital:

Parishioners in Moncton City Hospital and the Georges Dumont Hospital are reminded that if they wish to receive a visit from the parish priest, it is necessary to specifically identify themselves as being members of St. Bernard's parish when

they are admitted to hospital. The clergy visiting lists for priests and pastoral care visitors are printed out according to parish identification. This means that if you haven't identified yourself as belonging to our parish, the priest or pastoral care visitors will not be aware that you have been admitted to hospital and thus will not be able to visit. Due to changes in the "Privacy Act", PARISHIONERS IN HOSPITAL are reminded that if they wish a visit from a Priest, or to receive Holy Communion while in hospital, it is necessary to specifically identify themselves as being members of St. Bernard's parish and to state that "they wish to request a visit from a priest or from a member of the Parish Pastoral Care team." If they wish to receive a visit from the parish pastoral team, parishioners at the Georges Dumont Hospital are asked to contact the St. Bernard's parish office.



#### **Low Gluten Hosts**

Gluten intolerance has become more prevalent in recent years. Prompted by faithful Catholics wanting to receive Communion, we have ordered a supply of low gluten hosts (yields less than .01% gluten content per bread/wafer). We

already have a few parishioners that have sourced their own supply & place them in their own personal pyx for consecration at mass. If you are diagnosed with gluten intolerance, you must purchase your personal pyx and low gluten hosts <u>are now available</u> at our Parish office during office hours.

#### **PARKING**

Effective immediately parking is no longer free in the evenings and weekends in the lot on the corner of Botsford / Queen / Alma. HotSpot Parking will be operating the lot. They have developed an Application for mobile devices which allows parkers to use the lot for \$2 per hour. In order to use HotSpot, you need to have access to a smart phone or computer. The first step is downloading the app and creating an account. Should you park there and receive a notice on your vehicle, please heed the contents.

<u>City Hall parking lot is generally free on Sundays</u>. However, if the gate is across the entrance that means it is not free.

Downtown meters are free after 6 PM and on weekends.
