Gluten intolerance has become more prevalent in recent years. Prompted by faithful Catholics wanting to receive Communion, we have ordered a supply of low gluten hosts (yields less than .01% gluten content per bread/wafer). We

already have a few parishioners that have sourced their own supply & place them in their own personal pyx for consecration at mass. If you are diagnosed with gluten intolerance, you must purchase your personal pyx and low gluten hosts <u>are now available</u> at our Parish office during office hours.



Hospice Greater Moncton is a registered charity established in 2004 seeking to: promote awareness about life-limiting illnesses and end-of-life issues, provide support services to those with a life-limiting illnesses, provide grief and bereavement support services and to raise financial support to establish a residential hospice in Moncton, New Brunswick. Our services are free and confidential. They are available to those living in Greater Moncton, the Tantramar region, and outlying rural areas.

Their programs are available to anyone facing end of life issues. This can be you, a family member, or a friend. You can be referred by a health professional, or self- refer for your own care or that of a loved one.

Hospice Moncton is proud to work in conjunction with the New Brunswick Hospice Palliative Care Association, the Extra-Mural program and family physicians.

Community Palliative Care: Hospice palliative care focuses on the dignity and comfort of the dying person rather than on the aspect of incurable disease. Volunteer visitors can significantly improve the quality of life for individuals. They pass screening and confidentiality requirements and receive detailed training to national standards of care. They are supportive, open and non-judgmental listeners. Our coordinator will visit and match you with a volunteer with shared interests. The volunteer will visit in your home, and provide social, emotional and practical support, such as: provide companionship, offer a compassionate listening ear, and share in meaningful activities. During weekly visits, this support may include drives to appointments or for an outing, reading, baking favorite foods, listening, talking, playing cards, music, and quiet support as death nears.

Caregiver Care: The Hospice volunteer plays a vital role in providing care to patients in their own homes when their caregivers require time away from home to attend to personal matters.

Bereavement Care: Our Coping with Grief groups provide a safe, supportive and healing environment for adults living with grief to explore their feelings of loss. Facilitated by a compassionate leader in a small group setting, you can speak or just listen. This free program may help you make sense of the feelings and changes you are experiencing following the death of a loved one. Discussion topics may include: Sharing of grief loss with pictures and stories, discussion on grief and the journey it takes us on, & what are our loved ones thoughts and wishes for us?

Grief and spirituality: The grief group helps you through the heavy process of grieving with people who get it.

Become A Volunteer: Volunteer at Hospice Greater Moncton and become one of the caring volunteers who are truly making a difference! It's fun, interesting and you get to work with some of the nicest people! You will go home each day knowing you have made a difference in someone's quality of life.

The Reconnect Street Intervention Program provides short and long term assistance through outreach to youth and adults who are homeless or at risk of being homeless, in an effort to increase their knowledge about available resources.

The Reconnect Program comes under the umbrella of the YMCA, but is supported through many community partners, including the church communities. Monthly meetings take place between the Reconnect team and local churches to see what needs the team have responded to in the previous month, statistics about numbers served, and type of help requested. The team is very aware of accessible resources in the community to assist clients in times of emergency with a hope to move on with a more sustainable life for the future. Like the soup kitchens, the tragedy is that those needing this service have increased over the years.

Since Reconnect began, St. Bernard's has been a supporter in a variety of ways. Reconnect keeps a small supply of food/personal items for those on the street. As you can imagine their shelves always needs replenishing. There is an ongoing need for: non-perishable food items, grocery bags (to carry grocery items), and hygiene items. Can also use books/magazines for clients use. Donations may be dropped off at the office and from there they will be forwarded to Reconnect.
