

English Diocesan Liturgical Commission - Announcement on Posture

The English Diocesan Liturgical Commission has representation from the English parish units in our diocese and functions under the direction and guidance of Archbishop Vienneau, as well as the Episcopal Vicar, Rev. Allison Carroll.

As a liturgical commission, they were asked by the English Diocesan Pastoral Council (which is made up of all the priests serving our English parishes as well as lay people in leadership positions in our Church) to go out to all English churches in our diocese to address the topic of posture during mass and to re-affirm the directions given by the leadership of our diocese following the implementation of the Revised Roman Missal in 2011.

As faithful members of the Body of Christ we are all called to full, conscious, and active participation in every liturgy for which we gather. We are also reminded of the importance of being one with our brothers and sisters in every part of our community's prayer, be it times of singing, praying aloud or silent prayer. This also extends to our posture throughout the Mass. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, which is the primary source governing what we say, do and sing during the Mass. states that: "A common bodily posture, to be observed by all those taking part, is a sign of the unity of the members of the Christian community gathered together for the Sacred Liturgy, for it expresses the intentions and spiritual attitude of the participants and also fosters them."

Most inconsistencies in posture occur during the Eucharistic Prayer and the Communion Rite. The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops issued an indult to Rome, which is a request for a local exception to be granted that the current posture of kneeling or standing during the Eucharistic Prayer be allowed to continue in each parish, recognizing that each posture is equally appropriate. This request was subsequently approved. The emphasis here is not which posture is used, **but rather that all members of a parish community adhere to a common posture**. Also, by instruction of the Roman Missal, all members of the community are to remain standing from the beginning of the Communion Rite (which begins with the "Our Father") until the last person has received communion. If for health reasons, you cannot stand or kneel, you are free to maintain whatever position will provide comfort.

For many of us, we have not been taught that we can pray standing as well as kneeling, and that our prayers are just as heartfelt and valid. While there is a time for prayer on our knees, there is also time for prayer when we stand. And, while we all approach the table and receive the Body and Blood of Christ, we do so with eyes open, seeing our sisters and brothers who long to be fed, to be nourished, and who become the body of Christ, as do we.

Finally, it cannot be stressed enough that all liturgy, including the Mass, is by definition public ritual prayer. With that, we are all reminded to respect the practices of the parish community we worship with or are visiting, regardless of personal beliefs, since the liturgy is not about personal piety, but rather is the official public prayer of the Church gathered, the Body of Christ. **Saint Paul tells us this in 1 Corinthians 10: 16-17:**

"The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a communion in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? Because the loaf of bread is one, we, though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf" Archdiocese of Moncton
