**Redefining Palliative Care for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century** with Pamela Mansfield, MD, Palliative Care Division Head, Moncton Hospital, Horizon Health Network, & Asst. Professor, Dalhousie University takes place on Saturday, <u>Oct. 19<sup>th</sup>, 9:30 AM to noon at St. Bernard's Church Hall.</u> Dr. Mansfield will help us understand that Palliative Care is for anyone with a life limiting illness; explain what we can do to help someone with a life limiting illness; and discuss what leads to the request for medical assistance in dying.


**End of Life Issues & Estate Planning: Thinking Outside the Box** with Eileen Dennis, B.A., LL.B. a lawyer specializing in family, property and estate law, takes place on <u>Thursday, October 24<sup>th</sup> from</u> 6:30-8:30 p.m., also at St. Bernard's Church Ha</u>ll. Ms. Dennis will help us to understand what Advance Care Planning is and the importance of it; speak about the need to have conversations with loved ones to ensure our end of life decisions are respected; and explain what should be in the will, and what should be clarified beforehand. Pre-registration for one or both sessions is necessary and may be done by contacting Ellen.

**Baptism Preparation**: The revised diocesan-wide Baptism Preparation for parents presenting their children for Baptism was implemented in the archdiocese in March 2015 and has now been used by our parishes for 4 years. With the hands-on experience of those who facilitate these sessions for the parents, it is time to gather and dialogue with one another about the rewards and challenges of being involved in this ministry; what's working and (maybe) what's not; ways we can we more effective. Therefore, as a member of your parish baptismal preparation team, you are asked <u>to join Archbishop</u> **Valéry Vienneau and Ellen on Saturday, October 26 from 9:30 – noon at St. Bernard's.** Archbishop Vienneau will also offer a session on the Holy Spirit. (Illness comes in many different forms - physical, mental, psychological, emotional, spiritual)

- $\rightarrow$ Those who are facing or recovering from surgery or serious medical tests
- $\rightarrow$ Those suffering from a serious accident
- $\rightarrow$ Those who suffer from chronic illness such as arthritis or diabetes

 $\rightarrow$ Those who care for the sick, especially those who are closely bound in love to them.


