End of Life Issues & Estate Planning: Thinking Outside the Box with Eileen Dennis, B.A., LL.B. a lawyer specializing in family, property and estate law, takes place on Thursday, October 24th from 6:30-8:30 p.m., also at St. Bernard's Church Ha</u>ll. Ms. Dennis will help us to understand what Advance Care Planning is and the importance of it; speak about the need to have conversations with loved ones to ensure our end of life decisions are respected; and explain what should be in the will, and what should be clarified beforehand. Pre-registration for one or both sessions is necessary and may be done by contacting Ellen.


