Message from Archbishop Valéry Vienneau - Archdiocese of Moncton

The World Health Organization has declared the COVID-19 virus a public health emergency. The current overall risk to NB is still considered low by medical experts. However, the Public Health Agency of Canada has decreed that anyone who has travelled abroad in the last 14 days should self-monitor for two weeks from the day of their return to Canada. In other words, they take the situation seriously. While the authorities' message is reassuring and there does not appear to be any imminent danger in our region, public health officials are already urging us to take action to curb the spread of the COVID-19 virus. Several dioceses in Canada have already issued guidelines like those contained in this memo. For the protection and well-being of all parishioners, we must put in place, in all parishes of our diocese, certain precautionary measures until we are notified by the Health authorities that the situation has returned to normal.

<u>Church entrances</u>: All parish and other assemblies are to have enough supply of hand sanitizers so all in attendance may have access to the sanitizers upon arrival and at departure.

Avoid all handshaking.

All holy water fonts are to be emptied.

<u>Sign of peace</u>: Avoid all handshaking or any other physical touch. The sign of peace may be expressed with a bow, or some similar ritual gesture.

<u>Holy Communion</u>: Do not give communion on the tongue <u>or</u> under both species. No communion from the cup is allowed. Only the president of the celebration will drink from the chalice. Concelebrant priests will have communion by intinction.

<u>Communion Ministers (including the priests)</u>: <u>People with cold or flu symptoms</u> are to refrain from service as communion ministers. <u>All ministers of communion</u>, prior to and after the distribution of communion, will use hand sanitizer at the credence table or another suitable location. A sufficient number of ciboriums are to be on the altar throughout the Liturgy of the Eucharist, so that it is not necessary to move hosts from one ciborium to another by hand.

Remarks: Caution is also requested during visits to the sick, to the residences of older people or in any other place. Special attention should be given by catechists to all children. A memo has been sent by the diocesan coordinators for catechism (Ellen Bennett and Dianne Léger) concerning attendance and other considerations.

The most effective way to avoid spreading the COVID-19 virus is for an infected person to remain at home, rather than attend the Liturgy.

We do not wish to create a feeling of fear or panic, but our goal is to protect the health of people around us and our own.

Your vigilance and attentiveness for the elderly and the more vulnerable in health will reassure those who will participate in our celebrations. **Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.**
