# Where Are You Looking?

re we, like the disciples, looking in the wrong A direction? As they looked up to heaven, they probably realized what they had lost. Jesus was no longer in their midst. But then, the Easter stories all tell us that they never really understood his risen presence with them. And so they were asked: "Why are you standing here looking at the sky?" (Acts 1:11).


Are we also looking up to heaven when we should be looking out to the world? Of course, it is right that we reflect on Jesus' ascension. However, today's understanding of the universe helps us realize that the biblical account of Jesus' ascension into heaven may be a way of saying that he is glorified with God. As Paul says, he has been granted the place of honor at God's right hand, "far above every principality, authority, power, and dominion" with "all things beneath his feet" (Ephesians 1:21-22). Jesus, now with God, radiates the full splendor of his resurrection.

We must turn to the Gospel passage to get the fullness of the story of the ascension. Jesus did not say: "Watch what is going to happen." Instead he told them to go out: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). We might know these words so well that we miss their forcefulness. In effect, lesus is telling them: go out to the whole world and tell them what you have seen and heard. I did what it was for me to do; now it is up to you to do the rest. Don't worry, "I am with you always" (Matthew 28:20). Look where you're going, not where I went.






Today Catholics are invited to reflect upon the media of social communication (films, radio, television, newspapers, audiovisuals) and how these influence our lives.





#### Re - Opening of Churches-Phase 3 of the Recovery Plan in NB

NB Public Health and Premier Blaine Higgs announced in a press conference Friday, May 22, 2020 that we are now entering Phase 3 of the recovery plan. For us, this means that Masses can resume the weekend of May 30/31. We can hold celebrations (mass, weddings, or funerals) in our churches with a restricted number of faithful (50 maximum) following all the required health guidelines. Here at St. Bernard's that means a 4:00 PM Mass on Saturday, and a 11:00 AM Mass on Sunday beginning the weekend of May 30/31, 2020.

The elderly, especially after the age of 70, and persons with medical or at risk conditions are advised not to attend.

The <u>dispensation</u> (permission to be exempted from the laws or observances of the Church) of the Sunday <u>precept</u> ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays...# 2042 - Catechism of the Catholic Church) is extended for those who cannot go to church, inviting them to read the Word of God and pray in their homes and participate in the celebrations of the Mass Via the media (TV, radio, the internet).

#### To attend a Mass...you must register by calling the parish office at 857-0425

To be fair to all individuals wishing to attend Mass, a rolling list will be kept.

Meaning, you call the office once, indicate your preference of a Saturday or Sunday Mass, & how many person(s) will attend.

Your will then be given a date as to the Mass you may attend based on the allowed numbers.

#### Please note:

**Social distancing** of 6 feet is still essential. **Sanitizing** must be done upon entering.

Entrance and exit doors, only the main doors on Botsford St. will be used.

These doors will be clearly identified. No other doors are to be used.

#### Elevator will not be available.

Registered attendance will be checked upon entrance.

#### No procession at the beginning or end of Mass.

**No singing** allowed by the congregation. No song books in the pews.

Holy Water Fonts - will remain empty.

Parish contributions. Donation box will be placed at the entrance of the church.

Sign of Peace: Suspended for the time being

**Communion:** The individual dialogue of Communion (The Body of Christ. Amen) will be done <u>collectively after the response "Lord I am not worthy</u>...", followed by the distribution of Communion in **SILENCE**.

**<u>Communion procession</u>**: The community will be directed / guided as to how to process up for communion. <u>Social distancing of 6 feet must be respected</u>.

<u>At the end of Mass</u>: the faithful will be asked not leave the church at the same time as to avoid creating grouping. Leave the church according to a fixed order, respecting the rules of social distancing. (again you will be directed how to exit.)

The faithful are to avoid grouping or contacts among themselves or with the priest before or after services in or outside the church or in the parking lot.

Please be patient as we implement these new measures.

# Dear Padre,

#### I want to deepen the spiritual sense of Christ in my life. How can I create a strong spiritual connection to Jesus?

Your answer may be within your own parish. I suggest you begin your spiritual journey by connecting with a parish outreach group. When I worked as a missionary in Brazil, I marveled at how the youth groups that I worked with brought a deeper spirituality to my own life.

It was common in Brazil to have a three-day retreat leading up to Lent. Although this was a youth retreat, it also energized the adults who worked



with them. The highlight was on Ash Wednesday evening, when the teens would give public testimony at Mass to the Lord working in their lives. Their testimony inspired parishioners to rededicate themselves to educating the smaller children throughout the year. A youth group never lacks in spirit, which is usually contagious!

It's difficult to seek spiritual enlightenment alone. There's spiritual strength in numbers (even Jesus kept twelve disciples near him!), and even greater spiritual power within the graced walls of your parish. When you serve others, your spiritual path is deepened and expanded. Working with youths is just one

way to enhance your spiritual connection. Remember the words of St. Paul: "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit" (1 Corinthians 12:4–7). —Fr. John Gouger, CSSR
