Registering to attend Mass

St. Bernard's weekend Masses are Saturdays @ 4 PM and Sundays at 11 AM.

In a perfect scenario, we would be able to accommodate 75 persons for a Mass while still respecting the social distancing. However, that amount will vary depending on the configuration of those who register. (families & individuals) Bubbles & or families are seated together. We would not sit someone in an available seat unless they were in the same bubble & or family. As a result, we may not be able to use all of our available seating.

Those who are 70 years of age or older, or who have medical or at-risk conditions, should carefully assess the risk when making the decision to attend Mass.

The <u>dispensation</u> (permission to be exempted from the laws or observances of the Church) of the Sunday <u>precept</u> ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays...# 2042 - Catechism of the Catholic Church) is extended for those who cannot go to church, inviting them to read the Word of God and pray in their homes and participate in the celebrations of the Mass Via the media (TV, radio, the internet).

To attend a Mass...you must register each week

To reserve a spot for Mass:

- → Call the parish office each week 857-0425, Monday or Thursday between 9 AM to 2 PM.
- →Leave your name(s) & phone number.
- →Indicate your preference of a Saturday or Sunday Mass
- → How many person(s) will attend You will then be registered.
- → You will not receive a phone call confirming that you are registered.
- →Only those who we do not have room for based on social distancing guidelines, will be notified.

As you can imagine there is a great deal of work involved in taking reservations for Masses.

We ask for your continued patience as we navigate this new normal.

Elevator will not be available.

Please arrive a minimum of 15 minutes prior to Mass to allow for check in and seating.

Social distancing of 6 feet is still essential. (in and out of the church)

Entrance and exit doors - only the **main doors on Botsford St. will be used**. Doors will be clearly marked.

Registered attendance will be checked upon entrance.

Sanitizing - you will be given a squirt of sanitizer when you enter the church.

You will be ushered to your reserved seat.

No procession at the beginning or end of Mass.

No singing allowed by the congregation. No song books in the pews.

Holy Water Fonts - will remain empty.

Parish contributions. Donation basket will be placed at the entrance of the church.

Sign of Peace: No handshaking. Extend sign of peace with a smile, nod, etc.

<u>Communion</u>: The individual dialogue of Communion (The Body of Christ. Amen) will be done <u>collectively</u> <u>after the response "Lord I am not worthy..."</u>, followed by the distribution of Communion in **SILENCE**.

Communion procession: The community will be directed / guided as to how to process up for communion. Social distancing of 6 feet must be respected at all times.

At the end of Mass: do not leave the church at the same time - leave the church according to a fixed order, respecting the rules of social distancing. (again you will be directed how to exit.)

The faithful are to avoid grouping or contacts among themselves or with the priest before or after services in or outside the church or in the parking lot.



Many have asked about Fr. Carroll....so a brief note to update. He has had bypass (3) surgery and is recovering / recuperating. Obviously he will be out for a time, so we ask that you all pray for him and we will all give him the time and space for a full recovery.



With restrictions being lifted by the provincial government, allowing us to gather again as faith community we are in need of volunteers.

- 1. There must be a person checking people in & having them answer the Covid-19 questions.
- 2. There must be someone just inside the door supplying all in attendance with hand sanitizer.
- 3. There must be volunteers inside the church escorting people to their seats, while respecting social distancing.
- 4. The church must be disinfected following every liturgy.

During these difficult times anxiety and unrest seem to be all around us in many different ways. It is enough to make us give in to despair. However, as believers we need to remind ourselves of God's promises in Psalm 46. "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, even though the earth be removed, and though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea...Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations. I will be exalted in the earth! The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge" (1-2, 10-11). The word translated "still" is the Hebrew word rapha and can also mean release, abandon and let go. It isn't just being quiet. It is to release our anxiety—to trust in the Lord our God who is saying to us that He is our refuge. He is our source. He will help in time of trouble.
