However, expenses to run our church remain constant and increase as necessary maintenance / repairs are completed. *If you are able to*, please give consideration to continuing or making up your missed donations.





Friday @ 9:30 AM, Saturday @ 4 PM, & Sunday @ 11 AM

### To register for Mass:

- 1. Call the parish office @ 857-0425 each week
- 2. Friday Mass- register no later than 12 noon the Thursday before
- 3. Saturday / Sunday Masses register no later than 4 PM Thursday
- 4. Inform us how many person(s) will attend, leave name(s) of attendees, and a contact phone number.
- 5. Indicate preference of Friday, Saturday and/or Sunday Mass You will then be registered.

You will not receive a phone call confirming that you are registered.

Only those who we do not have room for, based on social distancing guidelines, will be notified.

Please arrive a minimum of 15 minutes prior to Mass to allow for sanitizing, check in process and ushered seating.

Persons 70 years of age or older, or who have medical or at-risk conditions, should carefully assess the risk when making the decision to attend Mass.

The <u>dispensation</u> (permission to be exempted from the laws or observances of the Church) of the Sunday <u>precept</u> ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays...# 2042 - Catechism of the Catholic Church) is extended for those who cannot go to church, inviting them to read the Word of God and pray in their homes and participate in the celebrations of the Mass Via the media (TV, radio, the internet).

### **Changes at Mass:**

The elevator is available. A mask must be worn both when entering the foyer to the elevator and in the elevator. Covid guidelines/restrictions will be posted on the outer doors of the elevator. These guidelines must be followed.

Social distancing of 6 feet is still essential (inside and outside of the church)

Entrance & exit doors - only the main doors on Botsford St. will be used

Registered attendance will be checked upon entrance.

Sanitizing - you will be given a squirt of sanitizer when you enter the church

You will be ushered to your reserved seat

No procession at the beginning or end of Mass

No singing allowed by the congregation. No song books in the pews.

Holy water fonts - will remain empty.

Parish contributions - Donation basket will be placed at the entrance of the church.

Sign of peace - No handshaking. Extend sign of peace with a smile or nod.

Communion - the individual dialogue of Communion (the Body of Christ. Amen) will be done collectively after the response "Lord I Am not worthy...", followed by distribution of Communion in SILENCE.

Communion procession & exiting the church after Mass - please stay in your pews until a usher guides to process for communion or exiting the church.

Always maintain 6 feet social distancing. Thank you for your patience and cooperation.



### St. Bernard's - Weekday Mass has resumed 9:30 AM timeframe remains the same, however, Mass will be on Friday rather than Thursday

While we are excited to be taking the next step in our return to some sort of "normalcy", we want to be cautious as well. (maximum of 50 persons per Mass) With that in mind, for the first little bit, it will be open to parishioners in our parish unit. (St. Bernard's, St. Vincent's and St. Clement's) You will have to call and sign up, just as you would for a weekend liturgy. We will follow the same protocols as we do on the weekend. Call the office no later than Thursday noon to reserve a spot for a Friday Mass. Unfortunately, if you are not registered, you will not be permitted to attend. Thank you for your understanding and we look forward to seeing you.



### World Day of Migrants and Refugees - September 27

A World Day of Migrants and Refugees is observed in many places in solidarity with the World Refugee Day promoted by the United Nations and observed since 2001 on 20 June. The January observance was instituted by Saint Pius X in 1914. At the request of several conferences of Bishops, Pope Francis moved the observance to September in 2019. "The phenomenon of migration today is a

providential opportunity for the proclamation of the Gospel in the contemporary world. Men and women from various regions of the earth who have not yet encountered Jesus Christ or know him only partially, ask to be received in countries with an ancient Christian tradition. It is necessary to find adequate ways for them to meet and to become acquainted with Jesus Christ and to experience the invaluable gift of salvation." (Pope Benedict XVI, 2012)

### Needs of the Church in Canada - September 27:

Every year the Bishops of Canada appeal for financial assistance. This collection helps each diocese make its annual contribution to the national Episcopal Conference and to the respective regional episcopal assembly (in the Atlantic, Quebec, Ontario, and Western regions). Any additional funds from the collection are at the disposal of the diocese for its own purpose.



National Police & Peace Officers' Day: Sunday, September 27, 2020: On September 24, 1998 the Government of Canada officially proclaimed the last Sunday of September of every year as Police and Peace Officers' National Memorial Day. This National Memorial Day gives Canadians an opportunity each year to formally express appreciation for the dedication of police and peace officers, which made the ultimate tragic sacrifice to keep our communities safe. Unfortunately, our comrades are

falling at an alarming rate, three to five officers per year. The first Memorial was held in 1978 and honoured 14 officers. Today the names of over 874 fallen officers are engraved on the Honour Roll tablets. After several years at a temporary place behind East Block, the tablets are back in their original location next to the Summer Pavilion overlooking the Ottawa River.
