Update on catechism: Given the announcement on Friday, October 9, 2020 by the Province of NB. and the NB Office of the Chief Medical Officer returning Zone 1. which includes the Archdiocese of Moncton, back to the orange level, all physically gathered catechetical sessions will temporarily move to a virtual platform via Zoom. Your parish catechetical coordinator will be in touch with you regarding additional details. Changes in the way we gather are happening frequently, as the situation continues to be very fluid. This is frustrating for parents we know. However, it is important that we all work together as responsible citizens and Christians with public health officials for the well-being of all. Please be aware that anytime changes must be made, you will be notified as quickly as possible. For those involved in catechism who have compromised health care issues, the Office of Faith Development has determined one session for each year level cluster will also be offered virtually for the duration of the catechetical year. Year levels 1, 2, 3 will take place Wednesdays at 6:00 p.m.; Year levels 4, 5, 6 will be offered Thursdays at 7:00 p.m. beginning the week of October 18th. Details on how to access the sessions will be received from your parish catechetical coordinator. It is important that we remember and acknowledge that these measures have only been put in place because of COVID-19; once we can gather again safely, we will. We thank everyone for their patience as we work through this unprecedented time. Now more than ever, it is important to remember, "I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew, 28:20)




Right now, it is planned that all meetings take place at the Diocesan Offices on York Street. Masks are mandatory. Please use the Dominion Street entrance.

#### October 9, 2020 - Update - COVID-19:

#### **Preventive Measures & Cancellation of Celebrations:**

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ Jesus,

On October 9, NB Premier Blaine Higgs and NB Public Health officials announced several preventive measures to stem the spread of the latest wave of COVID-19. They clarified that, "Zone 1 (Moncton area) and Zone 5 (Campbellton area) will return to the orange phase of New Brunswick's recovery plan for COVID-19 at midnight tonight."

Our diocese is part of zone 1. Here is the rule that particularly affects us: 'Religious services, weddings and funerals which take place inside and which bring together 10 people or less are allowed.' So, we can only hold celebrations with ten people or less. We are therefore back to the same situation as at the start of the pandemic, with our initial practices to deal with it:

- all Masses and Sunday celebrations of the Word will be canceled from the weekend of October 10 11, until further notice.
- smaller gatherings such as baptisms, weddings and funerals can still take place but with a number limited to 10 people. Other directives may be communicated in due course.
- all other parish activities or meetings with more than 10 people will be canceled. We pray for those affected by this virus, for those who are worried about it and for the caregivers who give themselves with great generosity.

These are very difficult times for our church and for everyone, but we must collaborate as responsible citizens and Christians with those responsible for Public Health for the well-being of all.
