THE END IS NIGH: Exploring the Book of Revelations: Can there be a better time to delve into the Book of Revelations than 2020????? Join Dr. Andrew Wilson and Dr. Fiona Black on <u>Tuesday</u>, November 24th from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. in this virtual session, as they look at Revelations as an example of "apocalyptic literature" an ancient mode of storytelling with a rich and evocative history, consider its place within our Christian tradition and explore what it might add to an appreciation of the topsyturvy times within which we live. This final book of the New Testament often poses a challenge to interpreters with its colourful and fantastical imagery of the end of days. At the same time, given the bewildering events of the past year alone, it seems more relevant to our current world situation than ever. Registration deadline is November 23rd. MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN DYING On October 20th, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops released a statement expressing their opposition to the re-tabling of Bill C-7, an act to amend the Criminal Code around medical assistance in dying re-introduced by the federal government on October 5, 2020. This statement is in addition to the joint ecumenical and interfaith statement released on 14 October 2020 entitled: "We Can and Must do Much Better – Religious Leaders in Canada denounce Bill C-7, 'An Act to amend the Criminal Code (medical assistance in dying)". As the legislation introduced this month remains unchanged from that which was tabled on 24 February 2020, the Bishops of Canada once again express their serious concerns regarding Bill C-7 and call upon all Canadians to express their opposition to the Bill. As said in the statement: "The proposed legislation of Bill C-7 remains deeply flawed, unjust, and morally pernicious. The Bishops of Canada call on Catholics and all people of good will to make their voices heard in opposition to the Bill. Similarly, all Canadian legislators should recall that no law that permits the taking of innocent human life can ever be morally justified. Such a law would always violate the intrinsic dignity of the human person." Please note that you must register each week to attend Mass. St. Bernard's Mass times are:

Friday @ 9:30 AM, Saturday @ 4 PM, & Sunday @ 11 AM

To register for Mass:

- 1. Call the parish office @ 857-0425 each week
- 2. Friday Mass- register no later than 12 noon the Thursday before
- 3. Saturday / Sunday Masses register no later than 4 PM Thursday
- 4. Inform us how many person(s) will attend, leave name(s) of attendees, and a contact phone number.
- 5. Indicate preference of Friday, Saturday and/or Sunday Mass

You will then be registered.

You will not receive a phone call confirming that you are registered.

Only those who there is no room for will be notified.

<u>Please arrive a minimum of 15 minutes prior to Mass</u> to allow for sanitizing, check in process and ushered seating.

Persons 70 years of age or older, or who have medical or at-risk conditions, should carefully assess the risk when making the decision to attend Mass.

The dispensation (permission to be exempted from the laws or observances of the Church) of the Sunday precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays...# 2042 - Catechism of the Catholic Church) is extended for those who cannot go to church, inviting them to read the Word of God and pray in their homes and participate in the celebrations of the Mass Via the media (TV, radio, the internet).

Masks are mandatory. To be worn through entire Mass.

The elevator is available. A mask must be worn both when entering the foyer to the elevator and in the elevator. Covid guidelines/restrictions will be posted on the outer doors of the elevator. These guidelines must be followed.

Social distancing of 6 feet is essential (inside and outside of the church)

Entrance & exit doors - only the main doors on Botsford St. will be used

Registered attendance will be checked upon entrance.

Sanitizing - you will be given a squirt of sanitizer when you enter the church

You will be ushered to your reserved seat

No procession at the beginning or end of Mass

No singing allowed by the congregation. No song books in the pews.

Holy water fonts - will remain empty.

Parish contributions - Donation basket will be placed at the entrance of the church.

Sign of peace - No handshaking. Extend sign of peace with a smile or nod.

Communion - the individual dialogue of Communion (the Body of Christ. Amen) will be done collectively after the response "Lord I Am not worthy...", followed by distribution of Communion in SILENCE.

Communion procession & exiting the church - please stay in your pews until an usher guides you to process for communion or to exit the church.

Thank you for your patience and cooperation.

Registering for Christmas Food Box

Like most things this year, planning will be different with the Christmas Food Boxes. St. Bernard's will be supporting 50 boxes and registering individuals for those boxes. You will need to call the St. Bernard's Social Justice line at 204-4882 and leave your name and a phone number where you can be reached. If we cannot reach you at that number, your name will not be able to be registered. The person phoning you back will provide all the details and answer questions you may have.

The list of 50 names we register through St. Bernard's will be sent to the Food Bank and the Christmas Box will be delivered or can be picked up from there. Please note, no boxes will be prepared or delivered from the church this year due to COVID-19 guidelines.

Volunteers - because we will not be preparing food boxes or doing deliveries at the church this year, anyone who wishes to volunteer with this activity may contact the Food Bank at 383-4281 to offer their assistance with this important charitable work this Christmas season.

Since the early 1950's parishioners have always been so generous with the Christmas Boxes fund. This year we will be paying the Food Depot Alimentaire directly to sponsor the 50 boxes St. Bernard's is supporting. You can make your donation to the Christmas Boxes by sending an envelope to the parish with your envelope number on it, or name and address, so your donation can be recorded for tax receipt purposes (included with your St. Bernard's annual receipt). If you have any questions, please leave a message at the parish office 857-0425 and a member of the Social Justice team will return your call.

In the November envelopes, you will see an envelope marked 'People in Need' The funds from this collection are used throughout the year for various requests.
