Journey Through Advent: The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops has created this new online weekly video series to help the Canadian Catholic faithful prepare for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. A joint project involving the CCCB's Office national de liturgie, the National Liturgy Office, and the Office for Evangelization and Catechesis, the initiative was developed as a way, through the modern method of video messaging, to offer a resource that enriches faith formation during a time of joyful anticipation for the coming of the Lord and Saviour into the world. The videos serve as an introduction to the liturgical season and present reflections on the Gospel readings for each Sunday in Advent. The Most Reverend Douglas Crosby, O.M.I., Bishop of Hamilton and the Most Reverend Pierre Goudreault, Bishop of Saint-Anne-de-la-Pocatière, provide spiritual and pastoral guidance on the readings that illustrate the true meaning of Christmas. Especially relevant given the COVID-19 pandemic that places limitations on in-person gatherings for faith communities, it is hoped that *Journey through Advent* will be a source of deep spiritual solace and insightful preparation for all. The videos will be available on the CCCB website each Monday in advance of the upcoming Sunday celebration: November 23, 30, December 7 and 14. The series may be accessed via the following link:

Registering for Christmas Food Box

Like most things this year, planning will be different with the Christmas Food Boxes. St. Bernard's will be supporting 50 boxes and registering individuals for those boxes. You will need to <u>call the St. Bernard's Social Justice line</u> <u>at 204-4882</u> and leave your name and a phone number where you can be reached. If we cannot reach you at that number, your name will not be able to be registered. The person phoning you back will provide all the

details and answer questions you may have.

The list of 50 names we register through St. Bernard's will be sent to the Food Bank and the Christmas Box will be delivered or can be picked up from there.

<u>Please note, no boxes will be prepared or delivered from the church this year due to</u> <u>COVID-19 guidelines</u>.

Cutoff date to register with St. Bernard's for a Christmas food box is Dec.10, 2020.
