#### **Sunday of the Word of God:**

On September 30, 2019, Pope Francis instituted the Sunday of the Word of God requesting that it be celebrated every year on the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time. Thus, in 2021, this Sunday falls on January 24. This month's "Living with Christ" publishes an article on the subject on pages 184-185.

In the motu proprio "APERUIT ILLIS", in 2019, the pope had suggested that "the sacred text be enthroned, in order to focus the attention of the assembly on the normative value of God's word... to highlight the proclamation of the word of the Lord and to emphasize in the homily the honour that it is due". The pope had also suggested that the priests "find ways of giving a Bible, or one of its books, to the entire assembly as a way of showing the importance of learning how to read, appreciate and pray daily with sacred Scripture, especially through the practice of lectio divina".

The third Sunday in Ordinary Time falls during that part of the year when the Church prays for Christian unity. That means the celebration of the Sunday of the Word of God "has ecumenical value, since the Scriptures point out, for those who listen, the path to authentic and firm unity".

Of course, we are limited by the restrictions imposed by health measures, but we can at least emphasize during the homily the importance that the Word of God must hold in our Christian life.

#### **WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY - JANUARY 18-25, 2021**

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is celebrated around the world on January 18-25, which are also the dates recommended by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops. However, there has been a long-standing practice by a number of communities to celebrate the Week of Prayer on optional dates, in order to include two Sundays. This universal week of prayer encourages Christians of all denominations to meet, to participate in various liturgical and other community activities, and to pray together that all may be on, as Christ desires.

The international resources for 2021 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity have been prepared by the Monastic Community of Grandchamp in Switzerland, a group of religious sisters from different church traditions brought together by a common vocation of prayer, community life and hospitality and by their commitment to Christian unity.

The 2021 theme – Abide in my love and you shall bear much fruit (John 15:5-9) – calls us to pray and to work for reconciliation and unity in the church, with our human family, and with all of creation. Drawing on the Gospel image of vine and branches, it invites us to nourish unity with God and with one another through contemplative silence, prayer, and common action. Grafted into Christ the vine as many diverse branches, may we bear rich fruit and create new ways of living, with respect for and communion with all of creation.

#### **COVID-19: ORANGE PHASE**

In-person services are limited to 50 participants.

Two meters (6 feet) of physical distancing.

Continuous mask wearing is required.

No singing is permitted.

Other indoor religious observances, funerals, marriage ceremonies, ... of more than 25 people are prohibited. (That includes celebrations for baptisms)

Wearing face masks is mandatory in public spaces, both indoors and outdoors."
