Attendance at Triduum Liturgies

With the limitations regarding attendance at our liturgies, we thought it good to give you a brief summary of attendance at the various liturgies. Parishioners were encouraged to list, by priority, the liturgies they wished to attend.

A total of 149 families made their wishes known. Of these, 85 listed a second preference, 31 a third preference and 4 a fourth preference.

- All but 4 of the 149 received their first preference, and the four that didn't, which was for Sunday at 11:00, were accommodated at the Sunday 9:00
- The two liturgies most in demand were Good Friday afternoon and Easter Sunday at 11:00. Requests for both were well over the number we could accommodate.
- For Good Friday, while all first choices were met, those second choices who could not attend at 3:00 were given the option of attending at 10:00 which meant that 59 of the 67 requests were honored, albeit not exactly as requested. Of those not honored, 5 were second choices, 3 were third choices.
- For the Sunday 11:00, as noted above, four families who requested the 11:00 were given the 9:00. None of the second and third requests could be honored.
- Other than Good Friday (3:00) and Easter Sunday (11:00), all second requests were filled, and 17 of 25 third requests were honored.
- No fourth requests could be accommodated at any liturgy.

We thank you for your patience and understanding, and we apologize for any slip-ups. I want to thank Darlene and Irene for the work they did in putting all this together. It was a challenge, and I think they rose to meet it.
