Take My Word for It

This is easier said than done. Growing up, we insisted on doing things ourselves, learning from our own experience, developing a sense of our own ability. We soon came to know that there are times when we should—in fact, we must—take someone else's word for something. If we refused to do this, we might be called a "doubting Thomas." Is that fair to us? Is it fair to Thomas?


As today's Gospel passage reports, gathered in a room, several disciples of Jesus experienced him truly among them. Thomas was absent. When the others told him what had occurred, he refused to take their word for it. To believe, he also would have to experience Jesus. It is unfair to credit them with faith and label him a doubter. After all, their experience probably convinced them, an event Thomas did not enjoy with the other disciples.

The point of this story is not Thomas' eventual visit by Jesus or his subsequent profession of faith. Rather, it is the source of such a confession. Thomas was unwilling or unable to accept the truth of the resurrection unless he saw Jesus and touched him. Jesus told him: "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed" (John 20:29). Blessed are you and me, who have come to know Jesus and the truth of his resurrection on the word of others—our parents and teachers, pastoral ministers and friends, those who have come to know him and who witness to this in their lives.

Indigenous Reconciliation Fund: To enjoy a more genuine relationship with our indigenous brothers and sisters, we must seek to understand the lingering pain of those who survived residential schools and of those who live with intergenerational trauma. As followers of Jesus, we are invited to look at past events with an open mind, acknowledge our mistakes, and find a new way to walk, neither in front nor behind but, alongside our indigenous brothers and sisters. Wanting to move from words to action, we need to become concretely involved in reconciliation projects. To this end, we will have the opportunity to participate in the May 7th and 8th Sunday collection

with the proceeds going to the Reconciliation Fund. The Fund will be managed by a National Board of directors, made up of various leaders, half of them, indigenous, who will be accountable for good governance and transparency in the administration of the funds. I am pleased to inform you that the money raised in our parishes will be returned to the diocese, enabling us to support local projects along with our four local Mi'gmaq communities. Next week, I will provide you with additional information to help in the planning of your donation come May 7th and 8th. Special envelopes have been distributed to parishes for this collection.

Naming Our Pastoral Unit

As announced last week, we have begun the process of selecting a name for our Pastoral Unit. Suggested names are to be accompanied by a rationale for the use of the name suggested. Parishioners have until **April 29** to submit suggestions. Reminder that names cannot be

those in use, or have been used, in the diocese. Submit suggestions to sbhf@rogers.com, mail to St. Bernard's Office, or drop off at your parish office. We will strike a committee of six, two from each parish, to short list the suggestions to a reasonable number, e.g. three (3). To help ensure objectivity, the suggestions will be given to the committee without any identifying information as to the person making the suggestion. Once the short list is decided, the names, with the rationale, will be published in the parish bulletins the weekends of May 21/22 and May 28/29, and posted on parish websites so that parishioners have time to discern their choice. Voting will follow on June 4/5. More on that later.

Sacrament of Reconciliation/Confession

Beginning Saturday, April 23, the sacrament of reconciliation/confession will be available each week at St. Bernard's from 1:00 - 1:30 (or until all have received the sacrament).



Dear Padre,

My friend is doing a Bible study, and part of the program is something called *lectio divina*. Is that a Catholic practice?

This method of listening to Scripture has the Church's approval. In fact, Catholic bishops have recommended *lectio divina* as an easy way for Catholics to become more familiar with the Bible. The practice of *lectio divina* is quite simple:

First, ask the Holy Spirit to help you listen. Then slowly read a short Scripture passage aloud. Listen for a word or phrase that strikes you. Next, think about why this word or phrase is so striking at this moment. Does the word or phrase touch your life right now? Then, ask God's help in making an important choice, or ask what the word or phrase that struck you in the first step means in your life. Finally, close your eyes, let go of all thoughts, and remain silent before God.

These parts have a logical progression, but it's not a hard-and-fast method. People who have been doing *lectio divina* for a long time sometimes move back and forth between parts. If you practice *lectio divina* regularly, over time your understanding of God's word will deepen.
